For Christians, the Feast of the Annunciation celebrates the moment that the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary she was going to give birth to the Son of God.In Lebanon, which lives in fear that so called Islamic State will bring its extremism and violence across its border with Syria, the annunciation has become a national interreligious festival. The annunciation, which is so important to Christians is also part of the Koran as is the Virgin Mary who is referenced in it 37 times, more even than in the Bible. After the long civil war of the 1980s Mary has become a symbol of unity, striking a chord in this country that war after war has turned it into a by-word for inter-religious strife, so much so that in 2010, the government made March 25 a national holiday for Christians and Muslims. John Laurenson follows the crowds as they celebrate Mary and talk to Muslims and Christians
